

## Coast Salish Realia Lesson 1

### Journal/Reflective Writing

#### Learning Intention:

I can describe technologies used by Aboriginal people in BC and Canada.

I can write reflectively about what I learned to show what I know.



#### Learning Outcome:

- D2 describe technologies used by **Aboriginal** people in BC and Canada

#### Achievement Indicators:

- use appropriate terminology to describe **Aboriginal** technologies (e.g., travois, hide scraper, adze, weir)
- give examples technologies used to meet needs and wants in **Aboriginal** cultures, including those used for food acquisition and preparation, shelter, clothing, and transportation
- demonstrate knowledge (e.g., create a model, present an oral report) of how a selected technology was used in **Aboriginal** cultures
- give examples of technologies used by **Aboriginal** cultures today

#### Materials

Coast Salish Realia RL0117: cedar basket, cod lure, rattle, wool, spindle whorl, canoe bailer  
From Ab Ed Center: paddle, drum mask

#### Lesson

1. Review Essential Understanding and Learning Intentions (optional: 4 thinking questions)
2. Complete "Tool" Journal: Connect to background knowledge and ask students what they know. Students work individually and put what they know in one colour pen, collectively share answers and change pen colour—write down new ideas with new colour to show what they have learned from the group.,
3. Students at stations with 4 artifacts per station predicting what each artifact was made of and how it was used?
4. Read the information artifact cards and add information to worksheet
5. Move to next station
6. Reflective Journal Writing: Tool Journal response; add to journal.

Is it important to study to study other cultures and the technologies they used to meet their needs?
