## SCHOLARSHIPS

- \* **Schulich Leader Scholarships** are the largest and most prestigious undergraduate Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) scholarships in Canada, with a value of up to \$120,000 per award. This scholarship was established to encourage our best and brightest students to be the next generation of entrepreneurial-minded, technology innovators. A top student could win from our school!

**Schulich Leader Scholarships is open to all Canadian high schools** and cégeps with graduating students planning to pursue an undergraduate degree in an eligible STEM program at one of our 20 partner universities. Every high school in Canada may nominate one student per academic year; cégeps may nominate up to four students.

### Student eligibility criteria:

- Graduating high school or cégep in Canada in the 2023/2024 academic year
- Canadian citizen or permanent resident
- Plan to enroll in an eligible STEM program at one of our 20 partner universities
- Meet the following criteria:
  - Academic excellence, AND Leadership, charisma and creativity.
  - Strong consideration will be given to students with financial need

- Be entrepreneurial-minded and intend to pursue a career in one or more of the following focus areas:
  - Technology
  - Engineering
  - Entrepreneurship and business enterprise
  - Applied scientific research

**We are NOT considering students who:**

- Focus on activism (environmental/political/societal)
- Intend to become a practicing physician and/or medical researcher (e.g. Doctor, Dentist, Nurse, Psychologist, Pharmacist, Optometrist, etc.)
- Intend to become a Professor and conduct theoretical research
