Please be advised of the following alert for all routes in the Comox Valley Transit System:



<u>Service disruption facing customers in Campbell River and the Comox Valley.</u>

BC Transit is notifying its riders that Unifor Local 114 operating under PWTransit Canada has indicated increasing job action and will cease service in the Campbell River and Comox Valley Transit Systems as of the start of the scheduled service on Friday, December 15.

handyDART service has been deemed essential for customers with appointments related to medical needs and will continue to operate during this service disruption. All other customers with pre-booked trips will be notified of cancellation.

BC Transit is closely monitoring the situation and sincerely apologizes to customers for the inconvenience caused by this matter. We understand the frustration felt by customers, and that the job action is difficult for everyone involved in these communities.

BC Transit is the Provincial Crown Agency responsible for the delivery of transit services outside of Greater Vancouver. We contract the services of private operating companies to deliver these transit services. These companies hire and manage their own workforces.

The labour dispute is between BC Transit's contractor – PWTransit Canada – and their unionized employees. BC Transit will update customers as more information becomes available. Please Keep in Mind...

- The YDI is voluntary. Students, teachers, parent/guardians, and schools are free to withdraw from participating.
- 2.YDI data will be provided to your school in a School Report, followed by a District & Provincial Report.
- The YDI is a population-level tool not an individual assessment.
- 4. Youth's voices matter. The YDI lets youth know that we value their thoughts and feelings, and provides and opportunity for self-reflection.







Indigenous-Focused Graduation Requirement

The Indigenous-focused graduation requirement has come into effect for the 2023/24 school year. All students working towards the B.C. Certificate of Graduation (Dogwood Diploma) – in English or French – are now required to complete the new graduation requirement, including students at B.C. certified offshore schools.

GRASP Training will be at Vanier on January 10, 17, 24 & 31st in the afternoons. GRASP training is ideal for students who are looking at going into a health care, psychology, social work or other helping professions. GRASP is a fun and interactive gatekeeper training program presented in Vancouver Island schools for students Grades 8 to 12 interested in learning skills to be effective peer helpers. We cover self-awareness, communication, healthy relationships, boundary setting, community resources, suicide awareness, and how to access help for others.

The program is presented in four, two-hour sessions. Through a series of games, interactive discussion, group activity, written work, and role play, youth learn:

- Active listening skills
- The impact of social and cultural biases on listening and helping
- Why difficult situations can be turning points for the better
- The power of our choices
- How to respectfully communicate in an open and direct manner
- The differences between healthy and unhealthy relationships
- How to recognize manipulation
- When to set boundaries
- How to set boundaries
- Coping with crisis
- Suicide awareness, the importance of reaching out, and never keeping suicide a secret
- Community resource information
