Reports:

i. Principal's Report

- Start up with grade 8s and new students went really well
- This year, the day before became a Pro-D day (instead of previously having it in August) which allowed a great planning day with the support staff to kick off the year
- Spent time during that day discussing Mental Health, Environmental Awareness, and Indigenous Education. We really want to focus on Mental Health this year - surveys from last year with the grades 10-12 really highlighted that Mental Health should be supported. Establishing a committee to really focus on this.
- Enrolment: we are growing, we are about 20 over what the District projected last April.
 The District is growing as well (over 400 than what was projected). We are over 60%
 French Immersion right now and we are getting tighter in our numbers in French
 Immersion (at capacity in Grade 9 and the Grade 10 class is quite large as well). We are sitting at 968 students today.
- Events: Athletics are up and running, Performing Arts, Consent Awareness week, Truth and Reconciliation week is upcoming.
- October 18th Scholarship Presentation Evening (zoom on 6pm, sponsored by DPAC).
 Invites go out to all Grade 11 and 12 families
- October 6th is the Terry Fox Run
- FESL (School learning Plan)

School Facility: over the summer had some concrete work out front paid for by the
district which is great as it is now a usable space. Still looking at trying to develop a food
service/cafeteria space - still in discussions on options. Back parking lot was repainted,
added two accessible parking spots and limited the amount of spaces back there as well
to help cut down on the cars parked in the back. The four modulars received air
conditioning.

Q: Is there anything else happening throughout the district around Consent Awareness Week? A: May be a few presentations happening. That information can be sent out to parents.

Q: We talked last year about tables for lunchtime?

A: We have a quote as part of the Feeding Futures Grant money, but the available funds have significantly decreased - we are looking at potentially looking at those funds to help acquire the tables we are looking for.

Q: Was some of the concrete out there for that purpose?

A: Yes, kids are already sitting out there and it would be great to have picnic tables and make it a great space.
